Implied in this understanding of sin as a distortion of God's creative purposes, God's creative purposes for our lives and all of creation can be restored or healed if we acknowledge our complicity. We can change! We can experience life as God intends. We can be open to and participate in this transformation through God's power, because "all things are possible through God." During the Sundays of Lent we will consider the lives of various people from the gospels, whose lives were transformed by the power of Jesus Christ to make all things new.
